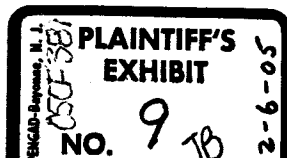

JAMES J. MEIDL, Lt., Mtwc. Co. Sheriff's Dept. being duly sworn on oath says (on information and belief) that on ~~19~~ or about the 2nd day of September, 1982 at the Town of Gibson in said County

and State, JERRY L. YANDA and STEVEN A. AVERY did as parties to the crime, intentionally mistreat an animal, to-wit: Poured gas and oil on a cat and started it on fire, contrary to Section 948.02 and 939.05 of the Wis. Stats. This offense is punishable upon conviction by a fine not to exceed \$10,000 or by imprisonment of not more than nine months, or both. (Class A Misdemeanor)

The complainant further alleges that he is informed by the reports of Kenneth J. Petersen, known to the complainant to be an officer with the Manitowoc County Sheriff's Dept., that on September 2, 1982 he reported to the Two Rivers Police Dept. where he was informed by Sgt. Wilda that Jerry Yanda had reported to the department and informed Sgt. Wilda that he along with Steven A. Avery had started a cat on fire and burned it to death. That Officer Petersen after advising Jerry L. Yanda of his Miranda Rights, received a written statement from Jerry L. Yanda wherein he admitted that he along with Steven A. Avery, took a cat which belonged to Steven A. Avery and poured gas and oil on it and threw it in a bonfire and then watched it burn until it died. That Officer Petersen was further informed by Peter A. Dassey, that he was present at the Steven A. Avery residence when Steven A. Avery suggested burning a cat. That Peter A. Dassey informed Officer Petersen that Jerry L. Yanda and Steven A. Avery started a fire and then got the cat and poured gas and oil on it and threw the cat in the fire.

The information provided by Kenneth J. Petersen is believed because he has provided true and accurate information in the past as a police officer. The information provided by Peter A. Dassey is believed because he is providing information as a citizen informant with no ulterior motive. The information provided by Jerry L. Yanda is believed because he is providing information against his own self interest.
